Notes for SAMUEL BLODGETT:

Samuel, the first child, and son, of Samuel Blodgett and Mary Russell, was born in Lexington 30 April 1727 according to The History of Lexington. He went to Woburn about June 1769, and married Jane Gillam 02 October 1772, but was reported absent in a list of male church members in 1793. He was a physician, very active in the Revolutionary War, taxed in the East List, 1775-1782, is supposed to have moved to Boston about 1788, when all trace of him is lost. 05 January 1772 he was dismissed from the church of Sunderland to the present First Church of Woburn.

Notes for SIMEON BLODGETT:

Simeon, the 2nd child and son of Samuel Blodgett and Mary Russell, was born in Lexington 05 January 1729/30. He married Susanna Skilton/Skelton 24 December 1761 and both were admitted to the Lexington church 02 January 1763. They had five children, Simeon, Joseph, Susanna, Lydia, Ruth and Sarah, all born or baptized at Lexington. Simeon was a soldier at the siege of Boston, May 02, 1775. The family was located at Woburn 23 November 1773. -- Town Rec. 9: 169. For military service see State List, 2: 199. He was still a resident in the South school district, Second parish, 1791.

TIMOTHY⁸ BLODGETT (*SAMUEL⁷, THOMAS⁶, SAMUEL⁵, THOMAS⁴, ROBERT³, ROBERT², THOMAS¹ BLOWGATE*) was born 07-April-1740 in Lexington, Massachusetts, and died 13-January-1831 in Deerfield, Massachusetts age 90. He married MILLICENT PERRY, daughter of JOSEPH PERRY and MARY LOCKE. She was born Abt. 27-March-1748 in Noodles Island, and died 08-May-1827 in Deerfield, Massachusetts age 79.

Notes for TIMOTHY BLODGETT:

Timothy was the son of Samuel Blodgett and Mary Russell, with 4 brothers and two sisters preceding him, and one brother born after him. He was a private soldier in Captain John Parker's Regiment of Minute Men, participated in the Battle of Lexington during the American Revolution. He petitioned for compensation for gun lost at Lexington, April 19, 1775 while on duty in Capt. John Parker's Company. Timothy's brothers, Isaac Blodgett, born February 01, 1744, and Josiah Blodgett, born December 28, 1737, were also members of Capt. John
